WELCOME TO WORSHIP

A Festival of Lessons and Carols was first held at King's College Chapel in England on Christmas Eve 1918. It was planned by Rev. Eric Milner-White, who had just been appointed Dean of King's Chapel after serving as an army chaplain. The service was first broadcast in 1928 and, except for 1930, it has been broadcast annually, even during the Second World War. Wherever the service is heard and however it is adapted, whether the music is provided by a choir or congregation, the pattern and strength of the service are derived from the lessons. The main theme is the development of the loving purposes of God seen "through the windows and the words of the Bible." The service starts somber, as we recall mankind's rebellion in the Garden of Eden, and gradually moves from prophecies to the great fulfillment in the Holy Gospel.

You'll notice that our lessons stop short of the birth of Jesus – and that is *intentional*. To hear the ultimate fulfillment of this story, join us again in worship on Christmas Eve at 10:00 am, 4:00 pm, or 7:00 pm. We also invite you to join us on Christmas Day at 10:00 am.

THE SEASON OF ADVENT

Advent (from, "advenire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas. The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. The liturgical color for Advent is purple or blue. Purple is a color that expresses royalty and penitence. Blue is the color of the sky and expresses hope.

Today, on the third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. The name "Gaudete" is derived from the Latin word for "rejoice," emphasizing the theme of joy and hope as believers prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. On Gaudete Sunday, the color rose may be used, symbolizing joy.

- All: Give us the light of Your grace so that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we may prepare our hearts to welcome Christ our Lord, whose coming is certain and whose day draws near.
- Leader: Let us pray... Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come and help us by Your might, that the sins which weigh us down may be quickly lifted by Your grace and mercy; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

CONFESSION OF SIN | PSALM 32:5; PSALM 51:10; 1 JOHN 1:9; JAMES 5:16

Leader: Brothers and sisters, let us acknowledge our sins and so prepare ourselves to celebrate God together.

We take a moment for self-reflection as we confess to God our imperfections.

Leader: For the times we've sinned against you in thoughts, words, and actions, Lord have mercy.

- All: Lord have mercy.
- Leader: For what we have done, and what we have left undone, Christ have mercy.

All: Christ have mercy.

- Leader: For not loving you with our whole heart, and not loving our neighbors as ourselves, Lord have mercy.
- All: Lord have mercy.
- Leader: Rejoice, for Almighty God, in His mercy, has given His Son to die for you. Your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- All: Amen.

Please be seated. We begin to reflect on God's promise of Emmanuel through scripture, song, and prayer.

OPENING PRAYERS

- Leader: Brothers and sisters: In the season of Advent, it is our responsibility and joy to prepare ourselves to hear once more the message of the Angels, to go to Bethlehem and see the Son of God lying in a manger. Let us hear and heed in Holy Scripture the story of God's loving purpose from the time of our rebellion against Him in Genesis 3, until the glorious redemption brought to us by His holy Child Jesus, foretold by the prophets, and brought forth in the Holy Gospel. But first, let us pray for the needs of His whole world... for peace and justice on earth, let us pray to the Lord.
- All: Lord have mercy.

Leader: For the unity and mission of the church for which he died, and especially for this church and all who gather here, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

Leader: For the poor and helpless, the cold, the hungry and the oppressed, the sick and those who mourn, the lonely and unloved, the aged and little children, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

Leader: For those who do not know and love the Lord Jesus Christ, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

Leader: For all the faithful who have gone before us, including Mary and Joseph, the whole multitude which no one can number, and those whose hope was in the Word made flesh, and with whom, in Jesus, we are one forevermore, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

- Leader: And now, to conclude all these petitions, let us pray in the words which Christ himself has taught us, saying:
- All: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

REBELLION AND FALL | GENESIS 3:8-15

Reader: In Genesis chapter 3, Adam and Eve listen to the serpent, rebel against God, and fall from grace.

⁸Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the Lord God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the Lord God among the trees of the garden. ⁹ But the Lord God called to the man, "Where are you?" ¹⁰ He answered, "I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid." ¹¹ And he said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree that I commanded you not to eat from?"

¹² The man said, "The woman you put here with me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it." ¹³ Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

¹⁴ So the Lord God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, "Cursed are you above all livestock and all wild animals! You will crawl on your belly and you will eat dust all the days of your life. ¹⁵ And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

²The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness, a light has dawned. ³You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder.

⁶ For to us a child is born, to us, a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

⁷ Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

PEACE IS COMING | ZECHARIAH 2, JEREMIAH 23, AND MICAH 5

Reader: In Zechariah 2, Jeremiah 23, and Micah 5, the prophets point to the Messiah who will come and bring peace.

¹⁰ "Shout and be glad, Daughter Zion. For I am coming, and I will live among you," declares the Lord. ¹¹ "Many nations will be joined with the Lord in that day and will become my people. I will live among you and you will know that the Lord Almighty has sent me to you. ¹² The Lord will inherit Judah as his portion in the holy land and will again choose Jerusalem. ¹³ Be still before the Lord, all mankind because he has roused himself from his holy dwelling."

⁵ "The days are coming," declares the Lord, "when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, a King who will reign wisely and do what is just and right in the land. ⁶ In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. This is the name by which he will be called: The Lord Our Righteous Savior.

² "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times." ³ Therefore Israel will be abandoned until the time when she who is in labor bears a son, and the rest of his brothers return to join the Israelites. ⁴ He will stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they will live securely, for then his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth. ⁵ And he will be our peace.

A PROMISE KEPT | LUKE 1:26-38

Reader: The angel Gabriel tells Mary about God's plan of salvation in the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the first chapter.

²⁶ In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷ to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you." ²⁹ Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be.³⁰ But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. ³¹ You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end." ³⁴ "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

³⁵ The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. ³⁶ Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. ³⁷ For no word from God will ever fail." ³⁸ "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her.

All: Praise to You, O Christ.

Reader: An angel appears to Joseph and reveals to him God's plan in the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the first chapter.

¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy

Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").
