

THE MEANING OF ASH WEDNESDAY

As we embark on the sacred season of Lent, we begin with Ash Wednesday. The outward sign of ashes flows from an inward look at our sin, an upward look to the cross, and an outward reminder Jesus came for all people. Though no one is required to receive ashes, the ashes serve as a physical and tangible reminder of the sin that Jesus Christ comes to die for.

CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

HOLY COMMUNION + WHAT WE BELIEVE

Communion is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and confidence that our Lord gives us not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table the baptized who trust in the words "my body... my blood... for you", repent of all sin, and seek to live by the Lord's ways. If this is not your belief, are a child who has not taken the First Communion Class or are unfamiliar with the belief of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, we invite you to come forward with your arms crossed so that we can give you a blessing by making the sign of the cross over you. OPENING HYMN | LSB 915 | TODAY YOUR MERCY CALLS US

Today Your mercy calls us to wash away our sin. However great our trespass, whatever we have been, However long from mercy our hearts have turned away, Your precious blood can wash us and make us clean today.

Today Your gate is open, and all who enter in Shall find a Father's welcome and pardon for their sin. The past shall be forgotten, a present joy be giv'n, A future grace be promised, a glorious crown in heav'n.

CONFESSION OF SIN | PSALM 32:5; PSALM 51:10; 1 JOHN 1:9; JAMES 5:16

Pastor: Dear brothers and sisters of our Lord Jesus Christ, on this day the Church begins a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection. Our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. From ancient times the season of Lent

has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope.

Let us pray that our dear Father in heaven, for the sake of His beloved Son and in the power of His Holy Spirit, might richly bless this Lententide for us so that we may come to Easter with glad hearts and keep the feast in sincerity and truth.

But first, let us acknowledge our sins and so prepare ourselves to celebrate God together...

We take a moment for self-reflection as we confess to God our imperfections.

Pastor: Hear our plea, O Lord...

All: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight. Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.

BLESSING OF ASHES

- Pastor: O God, you desire not the death of sinners, but our conversion. Mercifully hear our prayers, and in Your kindness be pleased to bless + these ashes. We receive them upon our heads to acknowledge we are but ashes and shall return to dust, so that we may, through a steadfast observance of Lent, receive newness of life as we worship Your Son, who lives and reigns forever and ever.
- All: Amen.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

The imposition of ashes is a voluntary observance. The outward sign of ashes flows from an inward look at our sin, an upward look to the cross, and an outward reminder Jesus came for all people. If you desire to receive a mark of ashes, you may come forward by the center aisle as directed by an usher.

RECEIVING OF GRACE

Please be seated as we enter the "Liturgy of the Word." Since the early days of the church, portions of the Bible have been read during worship so that all may be formed by the Word of God.

FIRST READING | EXODUS 2:1-10 | PEW BIBLE PAGE 79

Reader: Our first reading is from Exodus, the second chapter.

¹ Now a man of the tribe of Levi married a Levite woman, ² and she became pregnant and gave birth to a son. When she saw that he was a fine child, she hid him for three months. ³ But when she could hide him no longer, she got a papyrus basket for him and coated it with tar and pitch. Then she placed the child in it and put it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile. ⁴ His sister stood at a distance to see what would happen to him.

⁵Then Pharaoh's daughter went down to the Nile to bathe, and her attendants were walking along the riverbank. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her female slave to get it. ⁶She opened it and saw the baby. He was crying, and she felt sorry for him. "This is one of the Hebrew babies," she said.

⁷Then his sister asked Pharaoh's daughter, "Shall I go and get one of the Hebrew women to nurse the baby for you?"

⁸ "Yes, go," she answered. So the girl went and got the baby's mother. ⁹ Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this baby and nurse him for me, and I will pay you." So the woman took the baby and nursed him. ¹⁰ When the child grew older, she took him to Pharaoh's daughter and he became her son. She named him Moses, saying, "I drew him out of the water."

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING | 2 CORINTHIANS 5:16-21 | PEW BIBLE PAGE 1648

Reader: Our second reading is from Second Corinthians, the fifth chapter.

¹⁶ So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: ¹⁹ that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. ²⁰ We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. ²¹ God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

THE HOLY GOSPEL | MATTHEW 6:1-4, 16-18 | PEW BIBLE PAGE 1380

Leader: To honor the words and works of Jesus, please stand.

All: Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.

Leader: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the sixth chapter.

All: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹ "Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven.

² "So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honored by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. ³ But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

¹⁶ "When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. ¹⁷ But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, ¹⁸ so that it will not be obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

Leader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to You, O Christ.

APOSTLES' CREED

The Apostles' Creed serves as a timeless and foundational expression of the Christian faith, offering a sense of shared identity. We utilize the creed as a statement of belief about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

All: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

HOLY COMMUNION | ISAIAH 6:1-8; 2 TIMOTHY 4:22; COLOSSIANS 3:1; MATTHEW 26:26-28

The Sursum Corda (Latin: "Lift up your hearts") is an ancient Christian communion prayer. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we have been raised with Christ and now reign with him in heaven. We end this preface with the Sanctus (Latin: "Holy"). The Sanctus is one of the songs being sung in heaven before God's throne. We join our voices with the angels and those who have gone before us in the faith to give glory to God. After the Sanctus, we embrace the ultimate Mystery of Faith, as bread and wine become, for us, the Body and Blood of Jesus. Pastor: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.


Pastor: Lift up your hearts.
