As we celebrate Epiphany, we are reminded of the journey of the Magi and the recognition of Jesus as the Son of God by the Gentiles. May this season inspire us to share the light of Christ with others and recognize His presence in our lives.

# **CHILDREN IN WORSHIP**

If you brought little ones with you today — we are overjoyed to have them here. While your worship might feel more like a wrestling match, a battle of wills, or a circus... your time, efforts, and distracted worship are worth it. Even the messiest and most frustrating days are not wasted. # **HOLY COMMUNION + WHAT WE BELIEVE**

Communion is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and confidence that our Lord gives us not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table the baptized who trust in the words "my body... my blood... for you", repent of all sin, and seek to live by the Lord's ways. If this is not your belief, are a child who has not taken the First Communion Class or are unfamiliar with the belief of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, we invite you to come forward with your arms crossed so that we can give you a blessing by making the sign of the cross over you. We also encourage you to talk to one of our pastors after the service if you have questions.

Leader: For the times we've sinned against you in thoughts, words, and actions, Lord have mercy.


All: Lord have mercy.


Leader: For what we have done, and what we have left undone, Christ have mercy.

#### **RECEIVING OF GRACE**

Please be seated as we enter the "Liturgy of the Word." Since the early days of the church, portions of the Bible have been read during worship so that all may be formed by the Word of God.

#### FIRST READING | ISAIAH 60:1-6 | PEW BIBLE PAGE 1063

Reader: Our first reading is from Isaiah, the sixtieth chapter.

<sup>1</sup> "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you. <sup>2</sup> See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the Lord rises upon you and his glory appears over you. <sup>3</sup> Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. <sup>4</sup> "Lift up your eyes and look about you: All assemble and come to you; your sons come from afar, and your daughters are carried on the hip. <sup>5</sup> Then you will look and be radiant, your heart will throb and swell with joy; the wealth on the seas will be brought to you, to you the riches of the nations will come. <sup>6</sup> Herds of camels will cover your land, young camels of Midian and Ephah. And all from Sheba will come, bearing gold and incense and proclaiming the praise of the Lord.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

#### SECOND READING | EPHESIANS 3:1-12 | PEW BIBLE PAGE 1666

Reader: Our second reading is from Ephesians, the third chapter.

<sup>1</sup> For this reason I, Paul, the prisoner of Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles— <sup>2</sup> Surely you have heard about the administration of God's grace that was given to me for you, <sup>3</sup> that is, the mystery made known to me by revelation, as I have already written briefly. <sup>4</sup> In reading this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, <sup>5</sup> which was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to God's holy apostles and prophets. <sup>6</sup> This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus.

<sup>7</sup>I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. <sup>8</sup> Although I am less than the least of all the Lord's people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ, <sup>9</sup> and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things. <sup>10</sup> His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, <sup>11</sup> according to his eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord. <sup>12</sup> In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

## THE HOLY GOSPEL | MATTHEW 2:1-12 | PEW BIBLE PAGE 1374

Leader: To honor the words and works of Jesus, please stand.

All: Alleluia. Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Alleluia.

Leader: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the second chapter.

All: Glory to You, O Lord.

<sup>1</sup> After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem<sup>2</sup> and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

<sup>3</sup>When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. <sup>4</sup>When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. <sup>5</sup> "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written: <sup>6</sup> "'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.""

<sup>7</sup>Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. <sup>8</sup> He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him."

<sup>9</sup>After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. <sup>10</sup> When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. <sup>11</sup> On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him

with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. 12 And having been warned in a dream not to go back

to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

All: Praise to You, O Christ.

#### **APOSTLES' CREED**

The Apostles' Creed serves as a timeless and foundational expression of the Christian faith, offering a sense of shared identity. We utilize the creed as a statement of belief about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

All: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Sursum Corda (Latin: "Lift up your hearts") is an ancient Christian communion prayer.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we have been raised with Christ and now reign with him in heaven. We end this preface with the Sanctus (Latin: "Holy"). The Sanctus is one of the songs being sung in heaven before God's throne. We join our voices with the angels and those who have gone before us in the faith to give glory to God. After the Sanctus, we embrace the ultimate Mystery of Faith, as bread and wine become, for us, the Body and Blood of Jesus.

All: And also with you.


Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

# THE CALL OF GOD LIFE GROUP GUIDE | WEEK 1

- Share a brief personal experience of a time when you've felt "lost," spiritually or physically. How did you feel? How did you respond? How did things work out in the end?
- Read Matthew 2:1-12. What stands out to you in this passage?
- The Wise Men followed the star to find Jesus. Wouldn't it be nice if a bright star led our way today? Wouldn't it be nice if a sign in the sky flashed RIGHT or WRONG when we were making decisions? How are you "seeking Jesus" today? What guides you? Is that *in contrast* or *in line* to how non-Christians around you are being guided?
- Though perhaps history has mislabeled these three individuals who come to Jesus as "Wise Men" (theologians prefer to use the term "magician" or "Magi"), who are the wise Christians whose example you seek to follow? How have they impacted your life?
- Ephesians 3:1–12 discusses the mystery of Christ revealed to the Gentiles. How does this relate to the Wise Men, who were likely Gentiles, and what can we learn about the universality of God's call?
- Consider the gifts the Wise Men brought to Jesus—gold (representing his kingship), frankincense (a symbol of his priestly role), and myrrh (a prefiguring of his death and embalming). How have you seen people offer their "gifts" to God in their life? How might you be challenged to use your gifts to extend God's kingdom?
- What are practical ways you can "seek Him" in your daily life? Where are you struggling to "seek Him" now?
- End your time by sharing prayer requests.
