# WELCOME TO WORSHIP

Thanks for joining us today! Whether you were raised in a home that regularly worshipped, only went to church on Christmas and Easter, or are exploring the Christian faith for the first time – we are glad you are here. If you haven't been to a Lutheran Church before, our worship format might be a unique experience for you. Our service is filled with symbolism and ancient tradition that propels our hearts *upward*. Today, we encourage you to embrace the *extraordinariness* of our *ordinary* worship, where God forgives our sins, the Holy Spirit prepares us for daily life, prayers are lifted, heaven and earth converge, and the profound mystery of the Eucharist takes place. ## THE SEASON OF EPIPHANY

As we enter the season of Epiphany, we embark on a journey of revelation and illumination. Epiphany commemorates the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles, symbolized by the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus. The liturgical color for Epiphany is green, signifying growth, life, and the ongoing revelation of God's grace. During this season, we reflect on the light of Christ shining not only for a chosen few but for all people.

## **CHILDREN IN WORSHIP**

If you brought little ones with you today – we are overjoyed to have them here. While your worship might feel more like a wrestling match, a battle of wills, or a circus... your time, efforts, and distracted worship are worth it. Even the messiest and most frustrating days are not wasted. If your little one just needs a place to stretch their legs for a second, we have a staffed **Kid Care** for 0-2-year-olds on the second floor of the courtyard and a **Family Room** in the back of the sanctuary.

## HOLY COMMUNION + WHAT WE BELIEVE

Communion is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and confidence that our Lord gives us not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table the baptized who trust in the words "my body... my blood... for you", repent of all sin, and seek to live by the Lord's ways. If this is not your belief, are a child who has not taken the First Communion Class or are unfamiliar with the belief of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, we invite you to come forward with your arms crossed so that we can give you a blessing by making the sign of the cross over you. We also encourage you to talk to one of our pastors after the service if you have questions.

## THE CALL OF GOD LIFE GROUP GUIDE | WEEK 2

- What is something that you used to love to do or be a part of that has grown rarer in your life?
- Read 1 Samuel 3:1-10. What stands out to you in this passage?
- When Eli tells Samuel that God is the one speaking, he finally responds with: "Speak, Lord, Your servant is listening." Where has "seeking the voice of the Lord" proven beneficial in your life? Where have you plugged your ears and tried to figure it out yourself?
- When have you struggled to recognize God's voice (His will expressed through His Word)?
- Read John 1:43–51. What stands out to you in this passage?
- How does Nathanael's journey parallel Samuel's experience, and what lessons can we draw from it?
- Reflect on the idea that Jesus is the ultimate call from God. How does this concept shape our understanding of God's voice in our lives?
- Discuss specific ways we can actively listen and respond to God's call in our day-to-day lives. Consider what it might look like to carve away time for spiritual disciplines such as prayer, fasting, and reading God's Word.
- End your time by sharing prayer requests.
