WELCOME TO WORSHIP

Thanks for joining us today! Whether you were raised in a home that regularly worshipped, only went to church on Christmas and Easter, or are exploring the Christian faith for the first time — we are glad you are here. THE SEASON OF EPIPHANY

Epiphany follows the celebration of Christmas and lasts until the beginning of Lent. The liturgical color for Epiphany is white, symbolizing purity and the divine light that Christ brings to the world. As we celebrate Epiphany, we are reminded of the journey of the Magi and the recognition of Jesus as the Son of God by the Gentiles. May this season inspire us to share the light of Christ with others and recognize His presence in our lives.

CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

If you brought little ones with you today — we are overjoyed to have them here. While your worship might feel more like a wrestling match, a battle of wills, or a circus... your time, efforts, and distracted worship are worth it. Even the messiest and most frustrating days are not wasted. If your little one just needs a place to stretch their legs for a second, we have a staffed **Kid Care** for 0-2-year-olds on the second floor of the courtyard and a **Family Room** in the back of the sanctuary.

WHAT'S A "LUTHERAN"?

Simply put, Lutherans are *Christians*. We are catholic, but not Roman; orthodox, but not Eastern; evangelical, but not Baptist; reformed, but not Presbyterian. We hold to the *apostolic faith* (the faith of Jesus' apostles) and adhere to the principles of the Reformation, emphasizing Christ alone as the way to eternal life. We hold that the Bible is the inspired Word of God and has no error and that through God's Word and Sacraments (Holy Baptism, the Eucharist, and Absolution), we are forgiven, strengthened, and equipped to live as disciples. THE CALL OF GOD LIFE GROUP GUIDE | WEEK 3

- Share a brief moment of your life when you felt a clear calling or direction from God. How did you respond?
- Read Mark 1:14-20. What is the nature of the call that Jesus extends to Simon, Andrew, James, and John?
- How do the fishermen respond to Jesus' call, and what can we learn from their immediate obedience?
- Read Jonah 3:1-5. How does Jonah's response differ from the fishermen in Mark 1, and what are the implications of obedience or reluctance in answering God's call? Do you feel like you are more prone to be like the fishermen in Mark 1, or Jonah?
- What lessons can we draw from Jonah's experience about God's call (for all people) and the potential for transformation through repentance?
- In what ways can we "cast gospel nets" in our daily lives, following the example of Jesus and the early disciples?
- Share personal experiences of evangelism or moments when you felt prompted to share the good news of believing in Jesus.
- Discuss potential challenges in sharing the gospel with others. What prevents you from speaking openly about Jesus, or spurring someone on to explore Christianity?
- End your time by sharing prayer requests.
