Reader: Our second reading is from Galatians, the second chapter.

¹⁵“We who are Jews by birth and not sinful Gentiles ¹⁶ know that a person is not justified by the works of the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law, because by the works of the law no one will be justified.

¹⁷“But if, in seeking to be justified in Christ, we Jews find ourselves also among the sinners, doesn’t that mean that Christ promotes sin? Absolutely not! ¹⁸ If I rebuild what I destroyed, then I really would be a lawbreaker.

¹⁹“For through the law I died to the law so that I might live for God. ²⁰ I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. ²¹ I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing!”

Pastor: To honor the words and works of Jesus, please stand.

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the third chapter.

¹⁴Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, ¹⁵ that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him.”



Date: October 22, 2023

Message: Sola Fide

Text: Psalm 62:1-2, 5-8; Galatians 2:15-21; John 3:14-21

A note to begin: If sola Scriptura is the authority for theological discussion and sola gratia is the gift of salvific grace, sola fide is the means by which we acquire salvation: we are saved by faith alone. This does not mean that faith in and of itself is the primary good. Rather, it is the object of our faith that is good: Christ. Salvation is given as a gift through Christ and is accepted by faith, not by works. This distinguished the Reformers from the Catholic and Orthodox churches, which argued that works were *part* of the process of salvation (of which faith is also central). The Reformers argued that the works played no *salvific role* in justification. Unfortunately, faith and works are often thought of as opposites in theological conversation. But the Reformation was not a question of faith versus works, but about faith's relationship to works. Martin Luther, for example, who writes in his commentary on Romans, "Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, this faith; and it is impossible for it not to do good work incessantly. It does not ask whether there are good works to do, but before the question rises; it has already done them, and is always at the doing of them. He who does not these works is a faithless man. He gropes and looks about after faith and good works and knows neither." Good works are a result of true faith.


Other than faith in God, has there been a point in your life where you had to take a leap of faith? What was that like?

In your life, how have the themes of “faith” and “works” been presented to you? How has this molded the way you’ve viewed God?

Read Galatians 2:15-21 together. In this passage, Paul emphasizes that we are justified (saved) by faith in Christ, not by works of the law. Though no one, other than Jesus, has been able to follow the law perfectly – we tend to become legalistic people, relying on our works to somehow *save* us. How have you fallen into this trap?

Read John 3:14-21 together. In John 3, Jesus speaks about believing in Him for eternal life. What does “believing” look like? We know that belief changes the heart, but does it also change attitudes, behaviors, etc.? What is the relationship between faith and works?

End your time praying for one another.


