AS WE GATHER

Welcome to worship! Today is the first Sunday of Advent, a season of preparation and anticipation as we walk towards Christmas. Advent is a time of waiting and hoping. This season, however, can easily turn us into *grinches* for one reason or another. Over the coming weeks, we will look at different parts of "How the Grinch Stole Christmas" – with the knowledge that there's Good News for Grinches.

WELCOME AND INVOCATION

Leader: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: **Amen!**

LIGHTING OF THE HOPE CANDLE

Leader: We praise You, O God, for this Advent wreath that numbers the days of preparation for Christ's coming. As we light the first candle on this wreath, fill us with hope as we wait in anticipation for Emmanuel.

(The Hope candle is lit)

People: Give us the light of Your grace so that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we may prepare our hearts to welcome Christ, whose coming is certain and whose day draws near.

Leader: Let us pray... Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come. Through Your presence, deliver us from isolation and give us hope; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

FIRST READING

**PSALM 25:16-22
PEW BIBLE PAGE 788**

Reader: Our first reading is from the book of Psalms, the twenty-fifth chapter.

¹⁶ Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted.

¹⁷ Relieve the troubles of my heart and free me from my anguish.

¹⁸ Look on my affliction and my distress and take away all my sins.

¹⁹ See how numerous are my enemies and how fiercely they hate me!

²⁰ Guard my life and rescue me; do not let me be put to shame, for I take refuge in you. ²¹ May integrity and uprightness protect me, because my hope, Lord, is in you.

²² Deliver Israel, O God, from all their troubles!

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Reader: Our second reading is from first Corinthians, the twelfth chapter.

¹²Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. ¹⁴Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.

¹⁵Now if the foot should say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁶And if the ear should say, “Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁷If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. ¹⁹If they were all one part, where would the body be? ²⁰As it is, there are many parts, but one body.

²¹The eye cannot say to the hand, “I don’t need you!” And the head cannot say to the feet, “I don’t need you!” ²²On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, ²⁴while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, ²⁵so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. ²⁶If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Leader: To honor the words and works of Jesus, please stand.

People: Alleluia. Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Alleluia.

Leader: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the seventeenth chapter.

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹⁵ My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, even as I am not of it. ¹⁷ Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸ As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ For them I sanctify myself, that they too may be truly sanctified.

²⁰ "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, ²¹ that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

Leader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ.

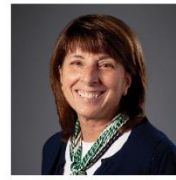
