
MARCH 29, 2024 | FRIDAY OF THE PASSION OF OUR LORD | THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS LITURGY





WELCOME TO WORSHIP

Whether you're a long-time member of our congregation or joining us for the first time, we are deeply honored to have you here to reflect, meditate, and journey together through the Stations of the Cross.

The Stations of the Cross is a devotion adapted from a custom observed by Christian pilgrims who said prayers in Jerusalem at a series of places in that city associated with the passion of Jesus. Traditionally, there have been as many as fourteen stations. Of these, eight are based directly on events of scripture and are included in this liturgy. In the Stations of the Cross, we trace the steps of Christ's final hours, contemplating the immense love and sacrifice that He demonstrated for every one of us.

During the service, we will hear from God's Word, listen to dramatized reflections from various characters (note: these dramatizations are not included in the canon of scripture), sing, and reflect on how Good Friday shapes our faith and life.

Tonight, we gather not only as individuals but as a unified body, bound by our shared faith. As we prepare our hearts for the liturgy, we invite you to open your hearts to the weight of the journey that Jesus walked on this very day so many years ago.

As you come into the Sanctuary, please keep silence as we observe the Solemn Passion of Christ. Silence your phone. Enter into reflective prayer, reflecting on your sin and shortcomings, and thanking Christ for His sacrifice. We suggest following each thought or prayer with the "Jesus Prayer": "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner."

+ OPENING RITE +

CONFESSION AND PRAYER

Pastor: All of us, like sheep, have gone astray. We have turned, every one of us, to his own way,

- All: and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.
- Pastor: Let us pray... Almighty God, graciously behold this Your family for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed and delivered into the hands of sinful men to suffer death upon the cross; who now lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever.
- All: Amen.

HYMN | LSB 611 | CHIEF OF SINNERS THOUGH I BE

HOMILY | AGNUS DEI

HYMN | LSB 550 | LAMB OF GOD

Your only Son, no sin to hide, but You have sent Him from Your side To walk upon this guilty sod, and to become the Lamb of God.

Your Gift of love they crucified, they laughed and scorned Him as He died: The humble King they named a fraud, and sacrificed the Lamb of God.

I was so lost, I should have died, but You have brought me to Your side To be led by Your staff and rod, and to be called a lamb of God.

+ FIRST STATION: JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DEATH +

READING | MATTHEW 27:15-24

¹⁵ Now it was the governor's custom at the festival to release a prisoner chosen by the crowd. ¹⁶ At that time they had a well-known prisoner whose name was Jesus Barabbas. ¹⁷ So when the crowd had gathered, Pilate asked them, "Which one do you want me to release to you: Jesus Barabbas, or Jesus who is called the Messiah?" ¹⁸ For he knew it was out of self-interest that they had handed Jesus over to him.

¹⁹While Pilate was sitting on the judge's seat, his wife sent him this message: "Don't have anything to do with that innocent man, for I have suffered a great deal today in a dream because of him."

²⁰ But the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowd to ask for Barabbas and to have Jesus executed.

²¹ "Which of the two do you want me to release to you?" asked the governor. "Barabbas," they answered. ²² "What shall I do, then, with Jesus who is called the Messiah?" Pilate asked. They all answered, "Crucify him!" ²³ "Why? What crime has he committed?" asked Pilate. But they shouted all the louder, "Crucify him!"

²⁴When Pilate saw that he was getting nowhere, but that instead an uproar was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd. "I am innocent of this man's blood," he said. "It is your responsibility!"

REFLECTION FROM PILATE'S WIFE

PRAYER

- Leader: Let us pray... Heavenly Father, like Pilate, we too can resist Your voice. Grant that, our desire for human respect, the fear of failure, and the clamor of the mob would never get in the way of listening to You.
- All: Amen.

O Dearest Jesus, what law hast Thou broken, That such sharp sentence should on Thee be spoken? Of what great crime hast Thou to make confession, What dark transgression?

+ SECOND STATION: JESUS TAKES UP HIS CROSS +

READING | MARK 15:15-20

¹⁵ Wanting to satisfy the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. He had Jesus flogged and handed him over to be crucified.

¹⁶ The soldiers led Jesus away into the palace (that is, the Praetorium) and called together the whole company of soldiers. ¹⁷ They put a purple robe on him, then twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on him. ¹⁸ And they began to call out to him, "Hail, king of the Jews!" ¹⁹ Again and again they struck him on the head with a staff and spit on him. Falling on their knees, they paid homage to him.²⁰ And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.

REFLECTION FROM BARABBAS

PRAYER

Leader: Let us pray... Heavenly Father, Barabbas was set free while the innocent One was led like a lamb to the slaughter. Grant that we would never take this sweet swap for granted, nor forget the willingness of Your Son to take a cross for us.

All: Amen.

SOLO FOR REFLECTION | RED LETTERS

+ THIRD STATION: SIMON HELPS JESUS CARRY THE CROSS +

READING | MARK 15:21

[As Jesus struggled to carry the cross]²¹A certain man from Cyrene, Simon, the father of Alexander and Rufus, was passing by on his way in from the country, and [the soldiers] forced him to carry the cross.

Leader: This is the Gospel of the Lord

All: Praise to You, O Christ.

PRAYER

Leader: Let us pray... Heavenly Father, stir up Your spirit within us so that we would bear the cross of Your Son with courageous hearts, and help us to share the burden of others. All: Amen.

+ FOURTH STATION: JESUS MEETS THE WOMEN OF JERUSALEM

READING | LUKE 23:27-31

²⁷ A large number of people followed [Jesus], including women who mourned and wailed for him. ²⁸ Jesus turned and said to them, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children. ²⁹ For the time will come when you will say, 'Blessed are the childless women, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!' ³⁰ Then "they will say to the mountains, "Fall on us!" and to the hills, "Cover us!""

³¹ For if people do these things when the tree is green, what will happen when it is dry?"

READING | MARK 15:22-24

²² They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means "the place of the skull"). ²³ Then they offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he did not take it.²⁴ And they crucified him. Dividing up his clothes, they cast lots to see what each would get.

Leader: This is the Gospel of the Lord

READING | LUKE 23:33-34

³³ [They crucified Him at the place of the skull], along with the criminals—one on his right, the other on his left. ³⁴ Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."

Leader: This is the Gospel of the Lord

All: Praise to You, O Christ.

REFLECTION FROM DISMAS

PRAYER

Leader: Let us pray... Heavenly Father, the thief Dismas gives up for us all. Help us to remember that your cross is a sign of forgiveness, even for hardened sinners, and lead us into paradise.

+ SEVENTH STATION: JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS +

READING | MARK 15:33-37, 39

³³ At noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. ³⁴ And at three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"
³⁵ When some of those standing near heard this, they said, "Listen, he's calling Elijah."
³⁶ Someone ran, filled a sponge with wine vinegar, put it on a staff, and offered it to Jesus to drink. "Now leave him alone. Let's see if Elijah comes to take him down," he said.

³⁷With a loud cry, Jesus breathed his last. ³⁹And when the centurion, who stood there in front of Jesus, saw how he died, he said, "Surely this man was the Son of God!"

+ EIGHTH STATION: JESUS IS LAID IN THE TOMB +

READING | MARK 15:42-46

⁴² It was Preparation Day (that is, the day before the Sabbath). So as evening approached, ⁴³ Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent member of the Council, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, went boldly to Pilate and asked for Jesus' body. ⁴⁴ Pilate was surprised to hear that he was already dead. Summoning the centurion, he asked him if Jesus had already died. ⁴⁵ When he learned from the centurion that it was so, he gave the body to Joseph. ⁴⁶ So Joseph bought some linen cloth, took down the body, wrapped it in the linen, and placed it in a tomb cut out of rock. Then he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb.
